WHO'S MAKING/RESTORING WHAT?

A List From Contributors

Anne Beetem Acker (Savannah, Ga, USA)

is reviving and upgrading a Hill & Tyre, 1980 German double for a private client in San Diego including adding a soundboard painting, new wooden jacks, restringing, and converting from a two way to three way transposer; restoring an 1873 Chickering concert grand for own collection; and restoring and upgrading an early Zuckermann spinet kit built by an important mid-20th century early music couple, now passed on, for their young grandson.

Peter Bavington (London, UK)

is making a small travelling clavichord, 3½ feet long, for a private customer.

Carey Beebe (Sydney, AU)

is restoring Arnold Dolmetsch clavichords #668 (1956) & #1091.

Colin Booth (Somerset, UK)

has just completed four single-strung Italian harpsichords, and is presently engaged in manufacturing around 1000 historical wooden jacks.

Robert Deegan (Lancaster, UK)

continues with a Flemish Single for a Scottish client and a Flemish Muselar Virginals for a lady in London. Also partly made (unallocated) is a single manual harpsichord after Perez-Mirabal, Seville, 1734. Very light inner framing and unorthodox soundboard barring feature in this 2 x 8' instrument.

David Evans (Warwickshire, UK)

is working on a copy of the Berlin Giusti.


Paul McNulty (Divisov, Czech Republic)

is making a fortepiano after Walter 1792 FF-g³ (for Hochschule Zurich); a fortepiano after Graf 1819 CC-c⁴ (for Hochschule Luzern); and a piano after Streicher 1868 AAA-a⁴ (for Viviana Sofronitsky - also as a rental for other musician's concerts and recordings).

Joris Potvlieghe (Tollembeek, BE)

is making a six-octave fortepiano after an 1816 Johann Fritz, of which the original is in the workshop (for Wim Winters, BE), and is making five unfretted clavichords in Saxon style 1770 (FF- f³, one for Luxemburg, two for America, one for Austria, one for the Netherlands (conservatory Den Haag).
