

The 8th annual Young Performers Festival will be held 23-27 May 2018 during the 2018 Bloomington (IN) Early Music Festival (18-27 May 2018). YPF 2018 will feature a partnership with the IU Jacobs School of Music, the Historical Performance Institute, and the school's Office of Entrepreneurship and Career Development. Student participants will benefit from an interactive programme of professional development opportunities facilitated by special guests from the field. Also new in 2018 is the addition of a separate "Showcase for Emerging Artists and Ensembles" in addition to the collegiate ensemble festival.

The Seventh Nordic Historical Keyboard Festival takes place 22-31 May 2018 in Kuopio, Finland. The programme includes performance by Dalyn Cook, Esther Yae Ji Kim, Elina Mustonen, Eija Virtanen, Anna Maria McElwain, Albert Mühlböck, Joel Speerstra, Miklós Spányi, Jan Weinhold, and Jocelyne Cuiller, with a wide range of clavichord repertory and one harpsichord performance. This cutting edge offering includes pairing with violin, poetry, and live installation. One performance features six of the performers on two clavichords. The festival also features a lecture by Dr. Claus Köppel. Incredibly, admission to all events is free! They have held an International Clavichord Composition Competition with entries due in February 2018; these will be performed at the festival. <http://www.nordicclavichord.org/>

7-9 June 2018, Orgelpark, Amsterdam Symposium: Clavichord and Organ, companions for centuries. The anniversaries of Johann Nikolaus Forkel (1549–1818) and Friedrich Wilhelm Marpurg (1718–1795) are celebrated. For information visit <https://www.orgelpark.nl>.

6-8 June 2018 Debussy as Early Music: The Piano and the Pianist in the Early Twentieth Century. A colloquy led by Nicholas Mathew (UC Berkeley). Mathews notes that “The Bechsteins that Debussy and Ravel loved, with their comparatively downy hammers, were lighter in touch and tone than most modern Steinways. Moreover, the ways in which performers interpreted their scores on such pianos may seem surprising to the present-day listener.” Because Debussy made piano-roll recordings, his performance practice can be investigated.

These questions will be the subject of a morning colloquy led by Nicholas Mathew (UC Berkeley) entitled “Debussy as Early Music: The Piano and the Pianist in the Early Twentieth Century,” which will feature performers and scholars associated, in evolving ways, with the early music movement, including George Barth (Stanford University) and Desmond Sheehan (UC Berkeley). In the afternoon, Alexei Lubimov will present Debussy’s piano music on the beautiful 1913 Bechstein piano owned by Berkeley’s venerable Piano Club. Lubimov’s career has encompassed harpsichord and modern piano, as well as award-winning performances of Mozart, Schubert, and Brahms on Viennese pianos, Chopin on French pianos, and C. P. E. Bach on the now obscure tangent piano. ECM New Music released his recording of Debussy’s Preludes, on a Steinway from 1913, in 2012.
