### OBITUARIES

Organist, conductor and composer **Noel Rawsthorne** (24 December 1929-28 January 2019) was Assistant Organist then Organist of Liverpool Anglican Cathedral from 1949-1980, and held posts as Liverpool City Organist and Senior Lecturer in Music at St Katharine's College, Liverpool.

Harpsichord maker **Bernd Fischer** (1945-2019) first worked for Adlam Burnett at Finchcocks building harpsichords and clavichords, then moved to a Harley Foundation studio at Welbeck in Nottinghamshire before eventually retiring to Germany.

Pianist, teacher and composer **Jörg Demus** (2 December 1928-16 April 2019) specialized in chamber music and lieder accompaniment, making numerous recordings and championing the fortepiano revival.

Conductor and organist **Ronald Woan** (27 August 1919-17 April 2019) was Director of Music at the Anglican Cathedral in Liverpool from 1947 to 1983.

Harpsichord builder **Cynthia Goudzwaard** (15 September 1955-28 April 2019) studied music, piano technology and bassoon at Michigan State University. She worked at Keith Hill & Associates and Tyre & Goudzwaard building fortepianos, harpsichords, clavichords and organs.

Editor and music publisher **Clifford Bartlett** (15 August 1939-12 August 2019) studied at Cambridge and then worked as a music librarian, including the BBC, before starting his own publisher, King's Music. He was also Editor of *Early Music Review* and a former chairman of both the National Early Music Association and Eastern Early Music Forum.

Renaissance musicologist and administrator **Robert Judd** (12 February 1956-24 August 2019) studied at Kent State University, Rice University and the University of Oxford, then taught at California State University-Fresno. From 1996 he was Executive Director of the American Musicological Society.

## WORKSHOP NEWS

Anne Acker (Savannah, Georgia, USA) is doing a major restoration of a Hubbard French double for a client in New York State, making final tweaks on the Hood/Acker replica of a 6 1/2 octave 1816 Nannette Streicher fortepiano which will be available for concerts and recordings, and is shortly starting a Flemish double for a church in Florence, SC, USA. In addition, she is designing and supervising construction of a wonderful new auxiliary workshop at her Pennsylvania location.

**Peter Barnes** (Frome, UK) is making a Flemish single manual harpsichord after Delin, decorated by Jennifer Douglas, for early in 2020, and has been busy with repairs, refurbishments and second-hand harpsichord and clavichord sales, including instruments by Michael Johnston, Colin Booth and Douglas Hollick.

**Carey Beebe** (Sydney, Australia) is building a Ruckers double harpsichord on commission for a young Sydney musician.

**Colin Booth** (Wells, UK) is about to build his last harpsichord, based on an anonymous German two-manual harpsichord from around 1700 (wrongly signed 'Pisaurensis') for his own use. All of his ottavinos are now sold, the last two to customers in Washington DC.

**Lucy Coad** (Chippenham, UK) is currently halfway through the restoration of the 'First Fleet' square piano made by Fredericus Beck in 1780. The 1777 Beyer square piano restored by the workshop last year was inaugurated by Steven Devine on 10 September 2019 at the Horniman Museum.

**Andrew Durand** and **Pierre Gaillot** of The Music Room Workshop (Chiddington, UK) have recently completed the restoration of a 1780's Ganer square piano and are currently restoring an 1803 Erard Grand and a Longman & Broderip spinet, and also making a 4 1/2 octave spinet for a customer in London.

**Douglas Hollick** (Grantham, UK) has a Yaniewicz & Green (c.1810) square piano restoration completed, and is next restoring a six-octave Broadwood (1835) square, which is substantially original, including most of the strings.

**Kilströms Klavessinmakeri** (Enköping, Sweden) are currently building a copy of the 'Diem 1679' anonymous French double manual harpsichord. Next in the pipeline is a Hitchcock double.

**Klinkhamer Harpsichords & Fortepianos** (Amsterdam, The Netherlands) are about to deliver two double manual Flemish harpsichords; one after the famous Colmar Ruckers and the other after the Ruckers-Goujon from Neuchatel, ordered by the Warsaw Philharmonic Orchestra.

**Jukka Ollikka** (Prague, Czech Republic) is currently working on a single manual harpsichord after Fleischer, a double manual harpsichord after Blanchet and two single manual harpsichords after Giusti.

**Armand Smit** (Cape Town, South Africa) is building a Stein fortepiano (1778) and a small Cembalino.
